Keep building those models!





1/48 Vampire F. Mk. 1 by Alley Cat, #ACRK 48-15

In January 1941 deHavilland Aircraft Company and Maj. Frank Halford were invited by the British Air Ministry to develop a new jet engine and jet fighter to complement the Gloster Meteor then in development. The result was the H-1 Goblin jet engine and the DH100 Vampire. It was a twin boom center pod configuration to keep the intake and exhaust losses to an absolute minimum and thereby maximize installed thrust. The front portion of the pod had a plywood and balsa shell but the rest of the airframe was metal. The engine was run for the first time by April 1942 and achieving design speed by early June. As installed in the prototype Vampire it developed 2700 pound of thrust. The Vampire first flight was on 20 September 1943. On 13 May 1944 the Vampire was ordered into production. The first Mk. 1s left the factory in early 1945 but failed to see service in World War II. They first saw service with 247 Squadron in April of 1946. Early on they were upgraded with 3000 lb thrust engines and able to reach 531mph. In late 1947 the Mk. 1 started to be replaced by the Mk. 3 with redesigned tail unit and increased fuel capacity.

The vampire had a very successful run with over 20 nations using them. Total production of single seat Vampires was more than 3000 aircraft built in several countries including France, Switzerland and Australia.

The Kit

This is a multi media kit consisting of 24 gray resin, 5 clear resin, 10 white metal, a photo etch fret, a canopy, a canopy mask and decals for 3 aircraft. The parts are all bagged except for the main aft fuselage/wings casting and packaged in a very sturdy top opening corrugated cardboard box. The decals are for VF272 of 501 Squadron, TG348 of 605 Squadron and TG385 of 3 Squadron. They appear to be opaque with good registration.

The molds look very good but have considerable flash and no locating pins. The main parts are: the one piece aft fuselage with the wings, the two one piece tail booms with integral rudders and fins and two front fuselage castings being split vertically. The instructions say it may need a shim to align with the aft fuselage. The molded in air intakes are rather deep and all the scribing is nicely done including the wheel wells. The nose moldings have nice cockpit side wall detail as well and with the supplied P.E. should really look good when completed. The horizontal stabilizer and elevator is one piece. There are two underwing drop tanks with integral pylons and a bunch of nice cockpit and other parts in a separate bag. One nice touch is the kit supplied nose weights - three of them. The P.E. fret is small but includes parts for the seat belts, rudder pedals, cockpit levers, main landing gear door mechanism and intake guides. The cast resin canopy is in two parts – windscreen and the aft blown bubble part. These parts will require some polishing or replacement. The landing gear parts are white metal and look good. The exhaust pipe is nice, thin and deep enough to hide the fact that there is no engine.

The instructions are on 3 pages of exploded views with 8 assembly steps. There is one sheet of color three views with profiles of the three aircraft featured on the decal sheet with clear indications of where the various decals go and what the airframe colors should be.

All in all a nice kit if you like multimedia or just have to have a Mk. 1 Vampire (Like me). But with my luck Trumpeter or Tamiya may soon come out with a Mk. 1 too. Trumpeter already has the Mk. 9 out. But it would entail a lot of work to make it into a Mk.1.

Recommended only if you like multimedia challenges.
