Summer is here and some of us will be taking vacations. You may think it might be nice to have another clinic before the IPMS Nationals in August, but the way I see it, if you haven't finished what you will be entering by now, put it aside and finish it when there is no pressure. I will not be planning a clinic this month, but instead it would be a great idea to bring in what you intend to bring to the nationals and discuss with fellow members what they think. Sometimes others see what you may have missed and you can still add something, or correct

an error.

This brings us to a topic we all have opinions on, judging. I have been judging for a very long time, with a few missed years in the middle. When I entered LISMS, Howard Belkin has always emphasized to look for basic building practices, seams, glue spots, decals, painting, and alignments. Then look for what the modeler added, after market accessories, and scratch built parts and how well it was accomplished along with the basic building practices. A long time ago, weathering was applied lightly by a few, and models were mostly built to a factory released item. When I returned to modeling about 2004 I saw a change that threw me into the realm of weathering I never imagined, using hair spray, pigments, oils, and acrylic paints. I thought I had to attend an art school! I tried some new techniques and materials but most were just not suited for me. Let me alter a saying. You just can't teach some old dogs new tricks. Bill Koppos has been helping me out when called upon and I thank him for this.

So this brings us to the judges. We emphasize that all judges at every show, judge fairly, no favoritism, and do not judge a category they entered in. I'd like to add one more and that is not to judge a category if you know the builder and is in your chapter. Well, for the most part most judges follow these points but I have seen some who don't. This is why we have teams of three judges and rotate them when necessary. I have seen a judge choose a model(s) to win when the model doesn't deserve to win in the eyes of the other two judges. A model deserving to win a place, didn't, and when asked one of the judges why, the answer was blamed on an alignment that couldn't be proven. I have experienced more instances too long to add. Judges like these give all shows a bad rap. I have been hearing from show visitors they don't enter the contest and just come to buy from the vendors. Model builders are our competition judges. We rely on them to be fair and when they aren't, they are ruining the enjoyment of the hobby for many others. I guess it gives unfair judges the opportunity to award themselves 'bragging rights'. I think judges in a team have to start speaking up on the spot if observing a questionable judge. Letting it ride will reappear in future shows.

So I will continue to enter my models in competition, knowing where my errors are, and hope the judges won't see them. The only way that will happen is if I treat them to 'drinks on me' at O'Malley's bar before judging. If you enter contests, enter to display and bond with fellow modelers. Build it your way, put it on your shelf, and take pride in your accomplishment. Keep on modeling!

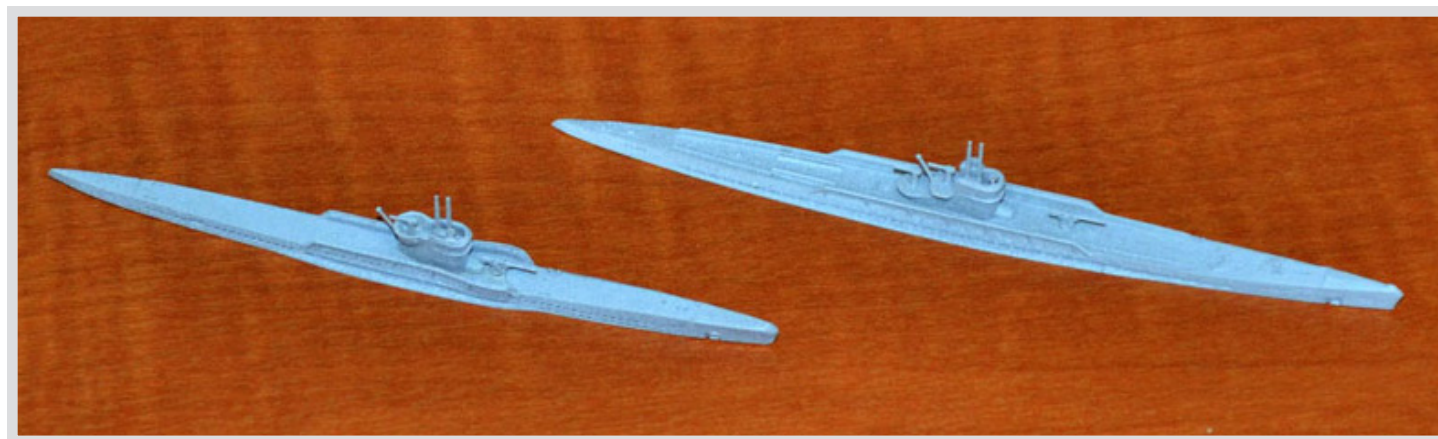

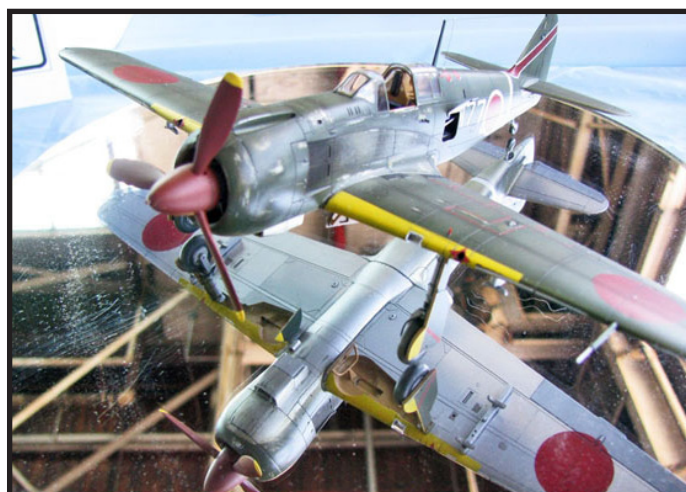

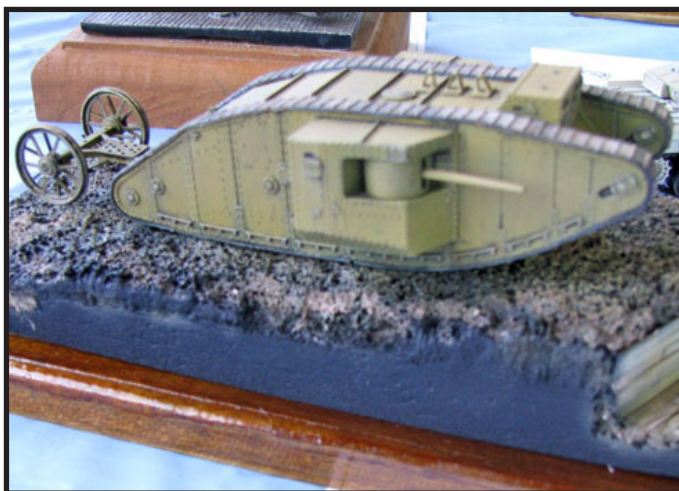
