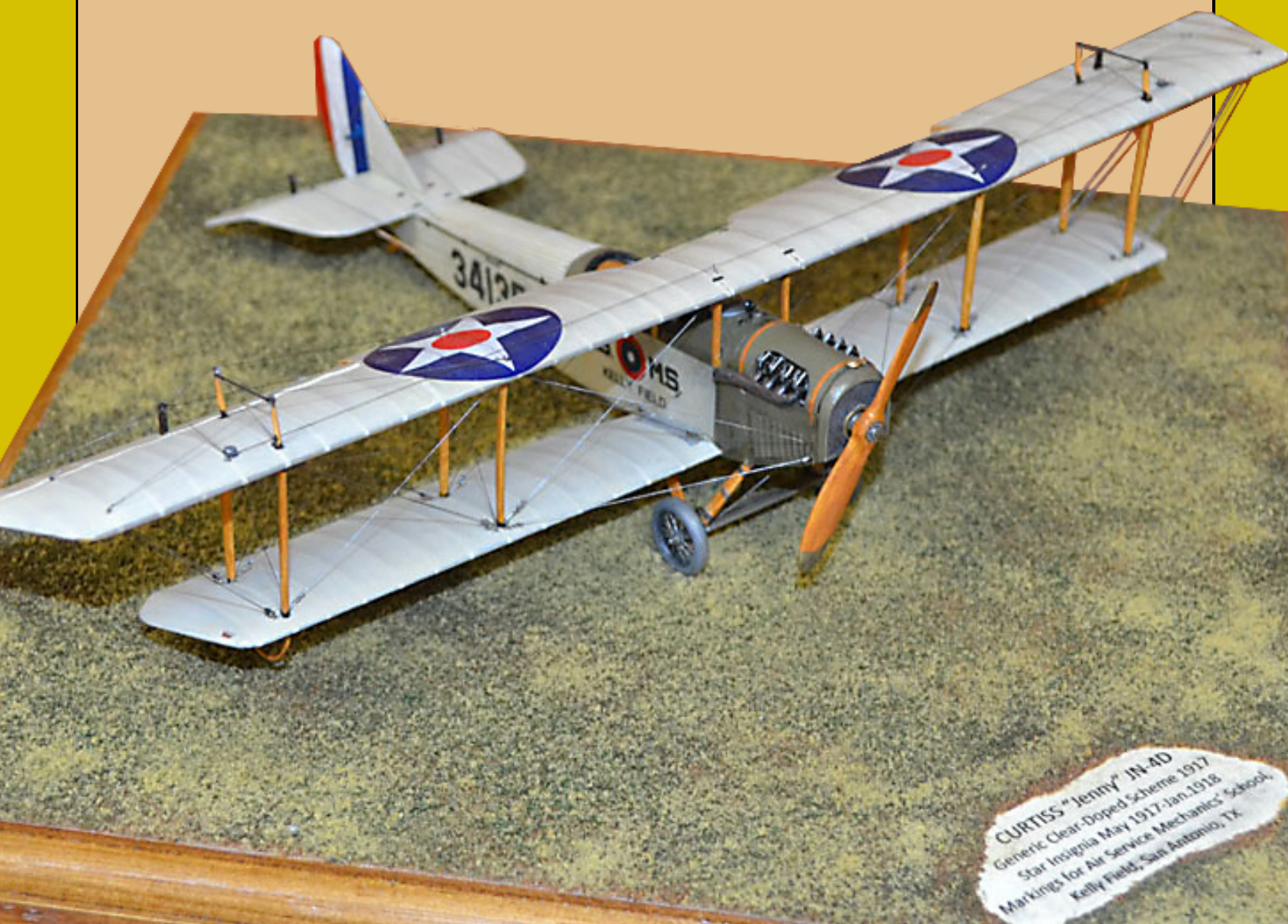

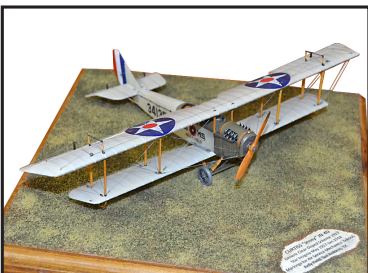

Well our show seemed to go over just fine. No complaints from vendors or modelers. I noticed a few mistakes in the G-S-B judging whereas the judges gave out multiple awards to the same builder in the same category. I do not have the printed out results from Fred yet to see how

much of an impact this made. Head Judges are supposed to check the category results before they go to Fred. We cannot reverse what has been done. So we move on and steps will be taken at future shows. I sent out 'thank you' e-mails to all members and vendors who attended. Prior to the show I sent out 176 e-mails to past modelers and visitors, and 109 snail mails to others who I did not have an e-mail for. Preliminary number results are 64 modelers entering about 290 entries, and 210 visitors. Past Replicon events hosted 80 modelers and 350+ entries. Why these numbers have been declining is a mystery and includes some modelers who have passed away. I see this in return e-mails and envelopes sent out.

Our next meeting is April 17th a few days before the AMPS Nationals in Danbury CT. I have reservations to be there and anxious to see what their Nationals draw. Armor is a very big part of the builders preference. From what I saw at RepLICon, I wondered where the aircraft builders went for there were some bare spots. At this meeting I will ask Rob if he can do the mud effects clinic again. We have a few new members and this clinic is very popular. I entered my M40 SPG in a couple of contests last year and it had not won. I used Rob's mud effects and won two awards in two contests. More Rob is needed!

I am trying to nail down a weekend date with the American Armor Museum to set up a demo day in the Fall. It might be a Saturday or Sunday. We will have at least six or seven separated tables with a pro modeler. This will be free admission to anyone who visits the museum. We aren't sure yet but the "Armor Experience" may be held on the same day and is sure to bring people into the building where we will be. We will show onlookers how we do our magic. We will also have our flyers available to hand out for our Spring show.

I didn't find out until the day after RepLICon that Roger's ashes were buried while RepLICon was rolling. Quite a coincidence. Roger may have been there in spirit. Too bad he didn't bring us more people?! I'll have to have a talk with him....

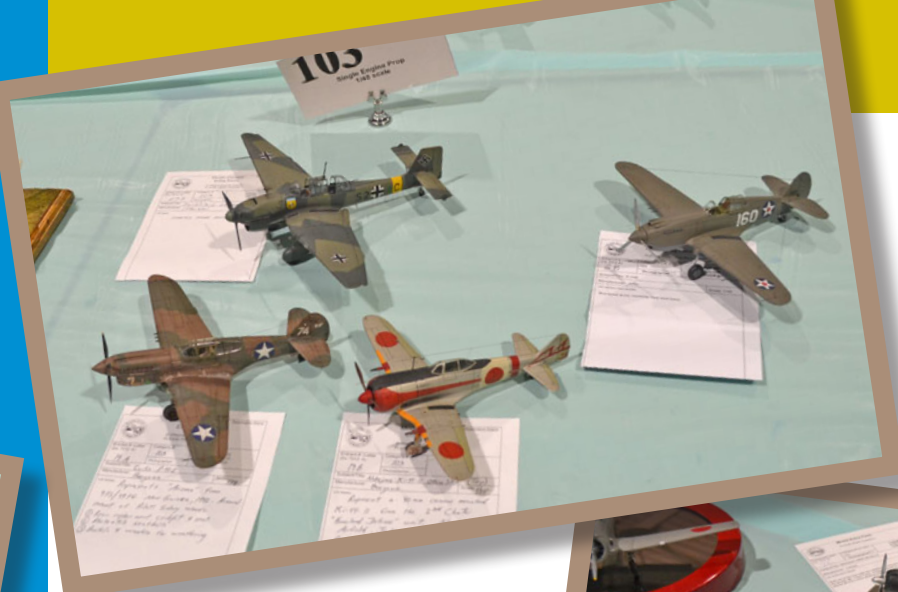

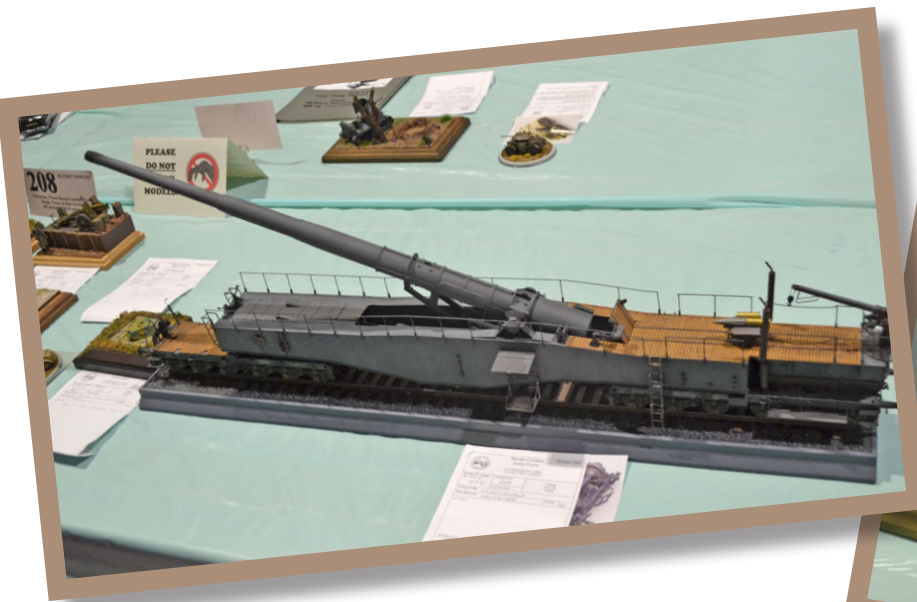

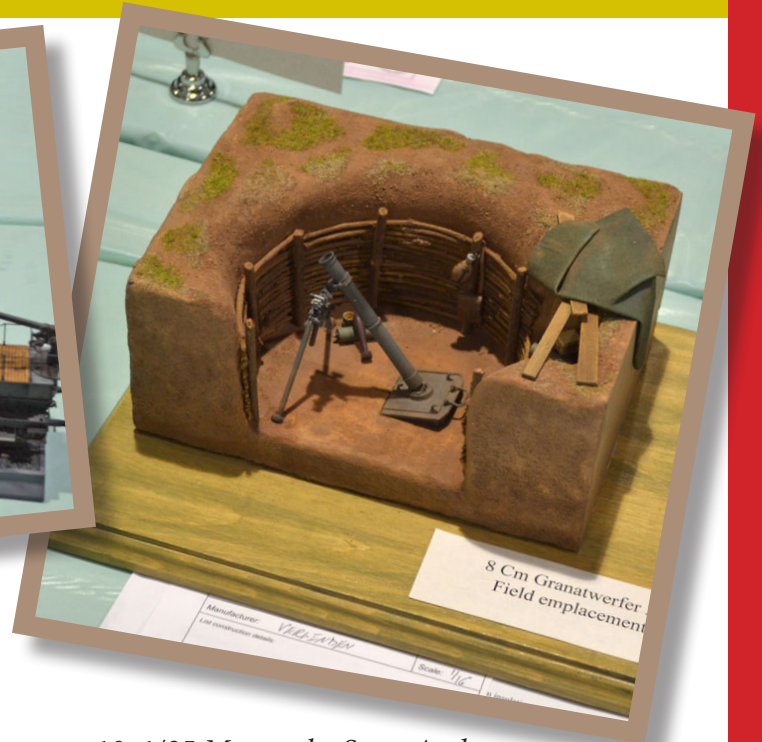

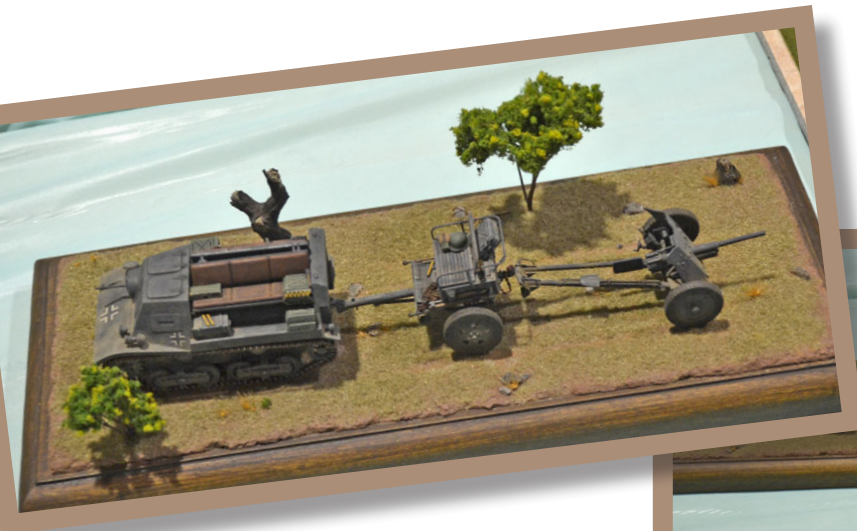

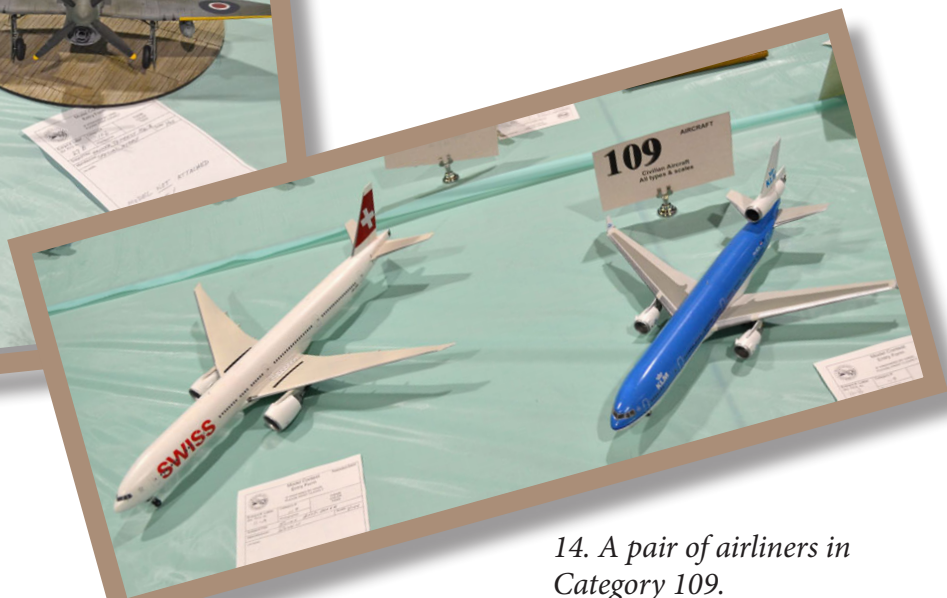

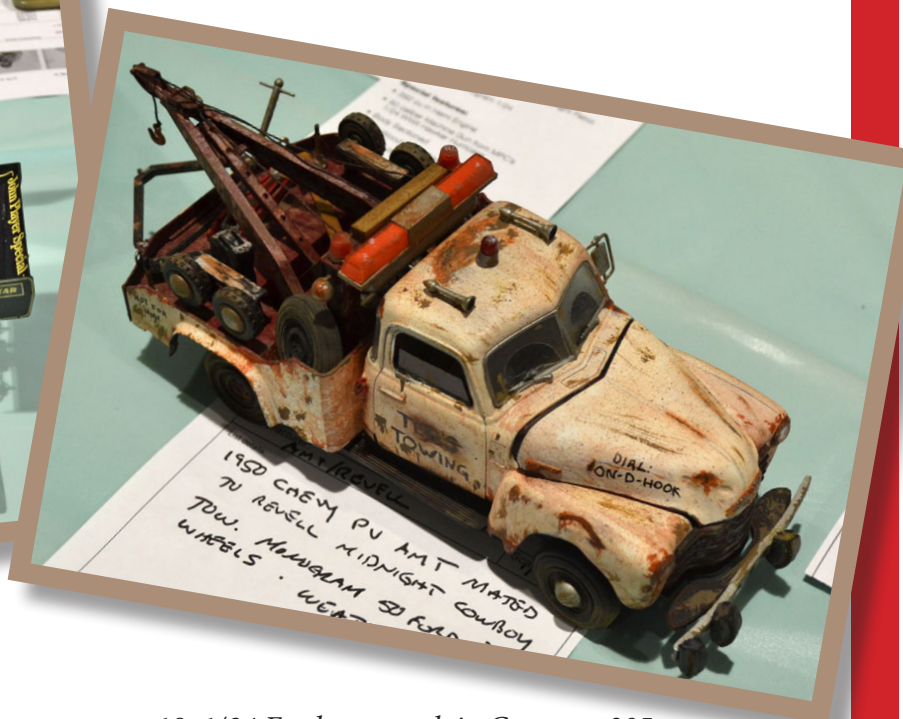

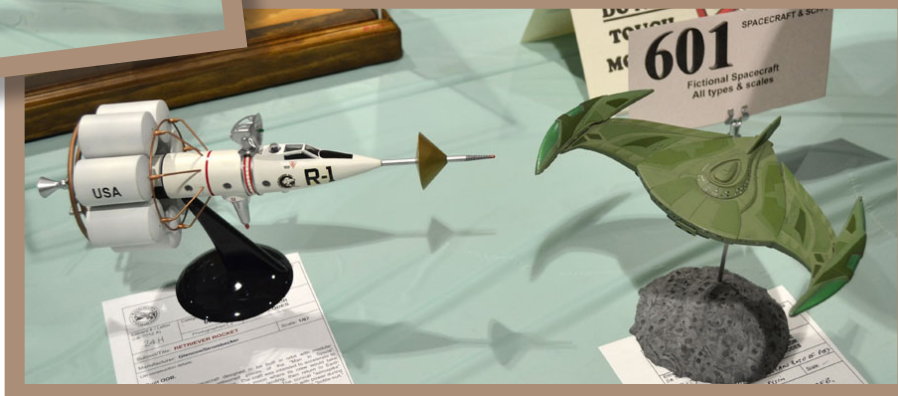

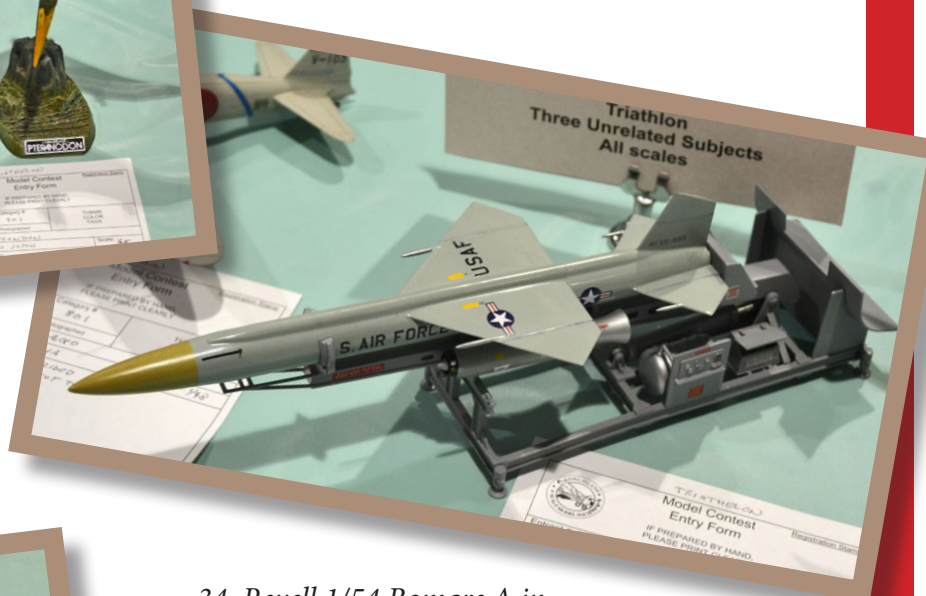

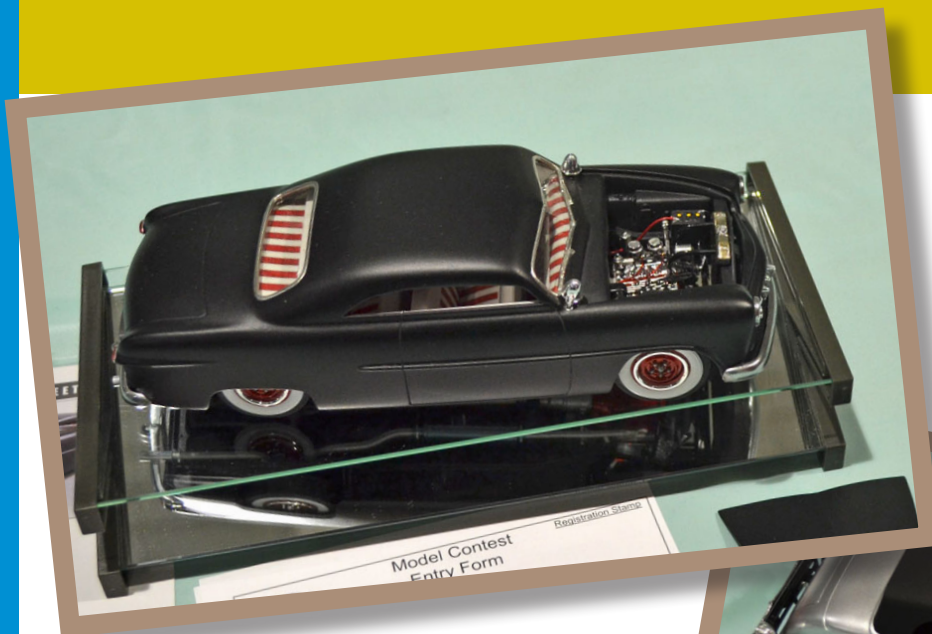

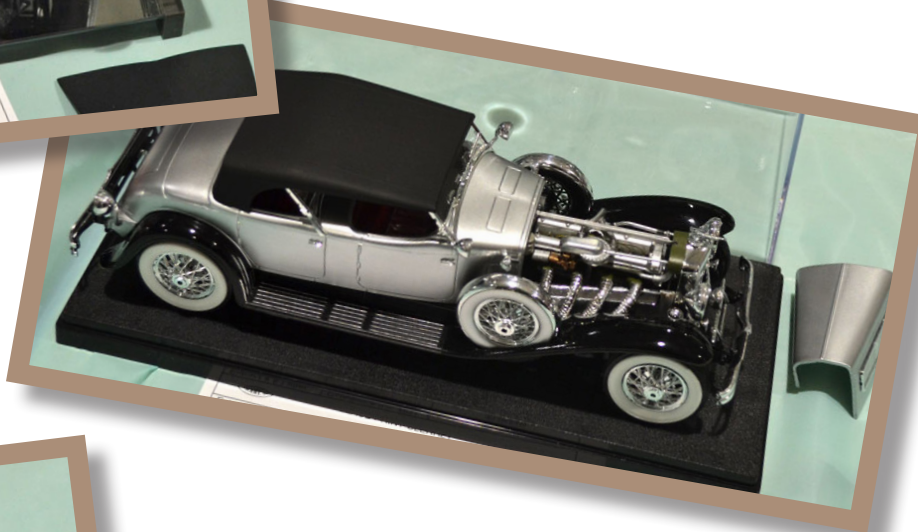

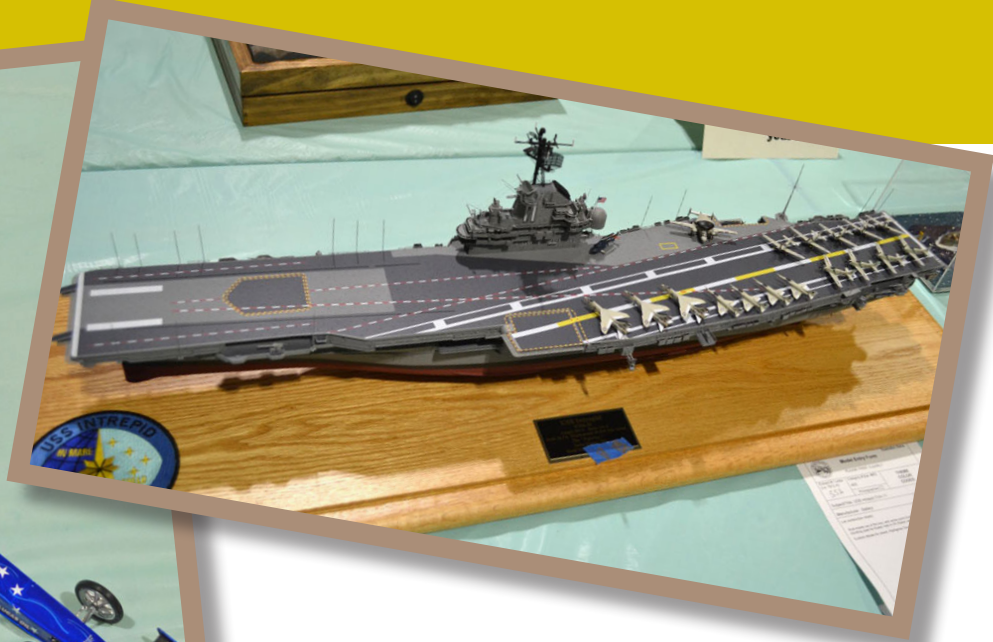
